Sleuthing on the trail to Jabez Wright

We have been contacted by an antique dealer regarding a portrait they valued at \$2000, supposedly that of Jabez Wright, the surveyor of Huron Township. His home was located in Grand Forest Beach and is recognized as a route on the Underground Railroad. The dealer's evidence that it is Wright's portrait is a scribbled note with his name. Officers are doing their due diligence trying to verify the subject of the painting and its value.

We know that the current owner purchased it from an art dealer who, in turn, likely purchased it from the Ohio Historical Society back in 1971. OHS could not confirm the sale. We have noted that Wright was a state representative whose portrait likeness is similar to Ohio's governors of that period, both in painting style and measurement. The dealer suggested that one of the famous Peale family portrait artists had similar techniques, which would very much add to its value.

Sleuthing locally, a portrait of Wright (on left below) was located at the Firelands Historical Society. Are these photos of the same man? Is it worth a 2.5 hour ride to Pittsburgh to make a purchase? Should an art appraisal be secured? Crawfords renovate 507 Main Street

Thank you to Crawford Insurance Group for being a ticket hub for our Old Plat Showcase and Fundraiser. The Crawford Building's history, with its many additions and tenants, dates to the 1800s as a home, grocery, and saloon. Known to many as Thomas Market, three generations of Thomas' operated there. When the Crawfords renovated the complex, the meat cooler in the rear of the building became the cord locker for the spools of cord used for the creations of Beagle Bay Knotworks. They are now renovating the home immediately south of the old market.
